Henry David Thoreau said that "poetry comes from the part of your vision that is in the corner of your eye." This class explores what he means by that. The workshop format includes poetry writing and reading, group discussion and creativity exercises.

Essay Writing

What is an essay and why do people write them? This workshop delves into the secret life of essays. Students will learn how to craft a persuasive essay on topics of their choice within a structured framework. The workshop format includes mini lectures on formal writing techniques, exercises to stimulate creativity and generate ideas, sessions on the process of writing and revision, peer critiques of student work and publication of their work.
